**Beautification Committee Update**

The Beautification Committee’s latest project was extending the lantana patch along the School Street fence. Two mock orange plants were also planted to serve as a border between the trash area and the extended row. As part of the project, the trash space was widened to accommodate heavier trash days. Moreover, portable skips with legs have been built to be placed over sections of the blooming lantana to accommodate extreme overflowing trash while protecting the plants during recurring special events such as the Bon Dance.

Committee members have been busy with other Jikoen activities and events but will resume their focus on other beautification projects in 2019.
