Each morning, the families will go to work, school or the Family Promise Day Center where they meet with staff, care for young children, learn life skills and seek housing and employment.

Jikoen will be responsible for Sunday 3/15 Dinner & Sleepover; Monday 3/16 Breakfast & Dinner and Sleepover; and Tuesday 3/17 Breakfast. Other temples will be covering the remaining dates and times.
