



Now registered voters simply receive their packets in the mail, complete the ballot in the privacy of their own home and safely mail it before the election day. This is entirely non-partisan and not telling anyone who to vote for. We would like to make sure that the voting process is safe and that important and experienced members of the community (our Sangha) are heard to help shape our future.

2020 Election Dates (from State of Hawaii Office of Elections Website)

October 5, 2020: Last day to register to vote and receive your ballot packet in the mail. If you have not registered by October 5, you must go to your local Voter Service Centers.

October 20, 2020: Voter Service Centers are open through Election Day. Services include same day registration and in-person voting.


