The day started out with icebreakers that quickly brought the group together. The day then evolved into important discussions and presentations. The most important discussion was conducted in small groups. The presidents of Hilo Betsuin, Waipahu, Lihue, and Paauilo Hongwanji's were in my group. Lois was in a group with the leadership from Aiea, Naalehu, Kamuela, and Kapaa Hongwanji's. It was invigorating to hear the challenges and successes in their temples as we discussed critical questions that included:

- 1. How can we attract younger members?
- 2. How can we encourage current members to be more active?
- 3. How can we help small temples on the verge of closing?

- 4. How can we get more visitors and get them to return?
- 5. How can we nurture next leaders?

Another important item on the program was Headquarter's staff presentations. Dave Atcheson, Tech Guru; Emi Hashi; Youth Activities Specialist, and Derrick Inouye, Business Manager, explained the services they provide to the temples.

The power trio behind the planning and execution of this historical event was Prudence Kusano from Windward Buddhist Temple, Nancy Shimamoto from Moiliili, and Jikoen's own Doris Oshiro. They interspersed important
